

Naming of a Public Place – "Karra Reserve" New Reserve in Seaton

1. EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

We engaged with the community from 9am Monday, 6 March 2023 to 5pm Monday, 27 March 2023 on a naming request for a new reserve in Seaton – "Karra Reserve".

The purpose of this engagement was to:

- Inform the community about the new reserve to be constructed by Renewal SA and handed over to Council, and of the naming request made by Renewal SA for the new reserve.
- Understand if the community supports the requested name, being "Kara Reserve", and invite
 any comment on the proposed name or what the naming of the reserve might mean to the
 public.
- Obtain information to be considered by Council when determining how the project will proceed.

Engagement was undertaken in accordance with our Reserve Naming Policy and Part 3 of Council's Public Consultation Policy (discretionary). The level of engagement was **'consult'**. The engagement outcomes detailed in this report will inform the Council's decision making by sharing the community sentiment on the naming request and comments received regarding the proposed reserve name.

The public was made aware of the consultation through a consultation fact sheet posted to the development's catchment area (247 distributed), onsite signage, a Your Say Charles Sturt project page and email campaign and a public notice in the Advertiser. During the period of open consultation, we had 138 visitors to the Your Say project page and received a total of 21 responses and submissions to the consultation (8.5% participation rate).

Overall, the sentiment in all responses demonstrated that 52.4% of respondents supported "Karra Reserve" as the reserve name, while 33.3% did not support the name "Karra", and 9.5% didn't mind, while 4.8% was indeterminate.

While 6 respondents provided comment or made a submission during the consultation, 1 was supportive of the proposal, 1 comment was supportive/neutral, and the remaining 4 comments/submissions were not supportive of the proposed reserve name, specifically a Kaurna name.

Targeted communication was sent to Kaurna Warra Karrpanthi (KWK) to advise of community engagement and seek cultural permission for the use of the Kaurna language in the reserve naming. This correspondence was sent on Monday, 6 March during the open consultation period, however we have not received a response to date.

2. BACKGROUND

We received a request from Renewal SA on 5 September 2022 to name a new reserve to be constructed within the Renewal SA development, located between Matthews Avenue and Glenburnie Street in Seaton. The reserve is 2665m2 in area, and will be constructed, developed, and vested to Council.

The name "Karra" means 'river red gum' in Kaurna language and reflects the significant tree in the reserve. This significant River Red Gum will be a feature of this reserve, and dictated the location of the reserve to ensure it was retained.

3. COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT APPROACH

This project is a matter set out in Part 3 of Council's Public Consultation Policy and, accordingly, the public consultation steps for this project have been determined by Council on a discretionary basis.

3.1 Engagement Objectives

The objectives of this engagement were to ensure:

- That our community has easy access to the appropriate information.
- That our community is given opportunities to provide feedback.
- That the process builds positive relationships between Council and the community, and positions Charles Sturt as an organisation that is providing sound management decisions.
- That information is provided to the community of the decision and reasoning for the decision.

3.2 Engagement scope

Formal community consultation was open for a minimum period of 21 days to allow the community adequate time to provide their feedback.

We posted 247 consultation flyers to the catchment area (Figure 1, Pg 4), providing a QR Code to the Your Say Charles Sturt project page and inviting the public to complete an online poll and/or share specific comment on the proposed reserve name. A downloadable PDF hardcopy feedback form was also available for those preferring to share feedback that way rather than via the online tools. Corflute signs (3) were placed on the temporary fencing surrounding the new Renewal SA development 1 facing Matthews Avenue, 1 facing Frederick Road, and 1 facing Glenburnie Street (adjacent Seaton High School). As per our naming policy, we also placed a notice in the Advertiser on Saturday, 18 March 2023 advertising the consultation and the opportunity to provide comment.

The purpose of the consultation was to understand the community sentiment regarding the name requested for the reserve. Specifically, we wanted to understand if they supported this name proposed or not and any local, historic, cultural, or personal information they wished to share about the proposal that should be considered in any decision. We were not seeking feedback on any other reserve features, uses or surrounds.

All related feedback received will be used to inform a final decision whether the request to name the new reserve in Seaton "Karra Reserve" is approved or not and, if not, what the next steps will be. Other factors that will influence the final decision may include the weight and merit of the initial request, expert advice, other historical, cultural, social, environmental, or economic factors, as well as Council's discretionary view.



5. ENGAGEMENT FINDINGS & KEY THEMES

5.1 Participation

Overall, we received 23 responses and submissions, 21 of which were unique (eg did not submit the same sentiment in different feedback forms), during the period of consultation. There were 17 responses to the naming poll, 5 responses to the comment form and 1 email submission. Of those who completed the poll, only 2 participants provided further comment which supported their poll preference. An additional 4 participants provided comments only, submitted by email or through the YourSay online comment tool.

5.2 Location of participants




Figure 3 – Graph of participants location by suburb.

The residential location (suburb) was available for 20 of the 21 unique participants. Only 3 participants resided in Seaton (**Figures 2 and 3**). The remaining participants were from surrounding and other suburbs across the City, noting these participants may still work or own property in the Seaton area. Regardless, the data indicates low, local participation in the consultation which could also indicate low, local representation in the consultation results.

Figure 2 – Participants represented by geographic location.

5.3 Results


For the purposes of establishing the overall level of support, the 4 unique comment submissions were categorised into 1 of the 4 poll options based on their sentiment - 3 were against the proposed name, while 1 was indeterminate.

On this basis the results of the 21 unique submissions made during consultation can be summarised as follows:

- 11 were in support of the proposed name
- 7 did not support the proposed name
- 2 did not mind what the reserve was called
- 1 was indeterminate

5.4 Comment submissions and sentiment

Positive/neutral sentiment

In relation to those who supported the proposed name, only 2 expressed further comment. These contributors valued the idea of using the significant tree as naming inspiration and as an opportunity to embed Kaurna language into community. It was also mentioned that the name will strengthen young people's connection to country and language. It was also suggested that either the street or the reserve, only, be named "Karra", but not both, and that we could name the street or reserve after an individual.

Negative sentiment

The remaining 4 comments did not support a Kaurna name but it's important to note that these comments were largely misinformed, inappropriate, or (inadvertently) derogatory in nature. Some of these participants (2) also suggested the reserve be named after a person (such as a resident who has made a significant contribution to community and/or the welfare of this City). A further respondent (1) who did not support the proposed name was in fact objecting to the construction of the reserve and felt that housing should be built on this land instead.

All written comments and submissions can be viewed in Appendix A.

6. NEXT STEPS

The Asset Management Committee will review the outcomes of community engagement, as detailed in this report, on the requested name - "Karra Reserve" - for the new reserve in Seaton and consider the findings when deciding on the matter. Following a decision of Council, all consultation contributors, the consultation catchment area, and other identified communities of interest will be informed of the decision through direct notification. The wider public will be notified via our online platforms including Your Say Charles Sturt and our public website, as appropriate.

Any resident of Charles Sturt can make a request to name a reserve, for example in recognition of an individual who has made a significant contribution to the City, and the request will be considered under the Policy guidelines.
