1. Project Overview

A number of streets in the suburb of Renown Park are reaching the end of their useful life and are listed for reconstruction in the next 4-10year Roads Program.

- Wright Street (from Torrens Road to Lamont Street)
- Tait Street (from South Road to Harrison Road)
- Bishop Street (from South Road to Harrison Road)
- Blight Street (Torrens Road to Harrison Road)

While planning for a road reconstruction we also like to investigate traffic safety and amenity of the street at the same time to ensure that resident concerns have been captured and assessed for current and future demand.

The Renown Park Streets are bounded by South Road, Lamont Street, Harrison Road and Torrens Road which are predominately made up of residential properties, with a very small number of business. The roads have been identified as being wider than an average local street with potential for residents to identify their own 'Living Streets Plan' for their street and the precinct.

Living Streets is about re-thinking the design streets and neighbourhoods to prioritise people, whether it be as a walker, bike rider, driver or for play. In the past local streets were once places for neighbours to gather and talk, they allowed kids to play without the feeling of being unsafe.

These days some streets can be car dominated, congested, unsafe and have little space for landscaping and activities to connect neighbours with each other.

By re-imagining the street, it allows community to take back what once was theirs and create places to come together and spend time.

Design ideas for your street could be:

- Creative artwork
- Places to sit and rest
- Wider verges
- Spaces for kids to play and neighbours to gather
- Links to ride
- Safer crossing points
- Greener streets with more landscaping and tree planting
- Additions to slow traffic
- Future use of land in the area

As there are no preliminary concept designs for any of these listed streets, Stage 1 consultation involved gathering of feedback to shape the streetscape concepts and overall design elements for further consultation.

This community engagement report summarises the feedback received for Stage 1.

2. Community Engagement Approach

Stage 1 Consultation (Issues, Opportunities and Improvements)


Residents were provided with an initial opportunity to discuss their aspirations and opportunities for their particular street and the wider Renown Park precinct as a whole.

Community engagement was undertaken between October and December 2019. We asked the local community how they currently use their street, what they love about their neighbourhood and what they would like to see improved through redevelopment of the road design.

We provided the opportunity for feedback through:

1.

- Online survey (YourSay Charles Sturt)
 - Seeking Questions through Q&A tool
 - Precedent Board (seeking feedback on images of existing road designs)
- 2. A co-design workshop which allowed residents to look at options for the road design and balance the elements they would like to see within the street with the space available.



- 3. A community open day which allowed residents to drop-in and identify issues and opportunities by making comments on aerial photography or to engage with a hard copy version of the online 'Precedent Board'.
- 4. A field trip and workshop with the local Brompton Primary School (Year 5 class) to seek the sentiment of the children following a tour through renown park.

The engagement was communicated through direct mail to local residents and property owners within the engagement catchment as well as online on the City of Charles Sturt's YourSay webpage.

3. Consultation Feedback

During the first stage of consultation, we had 4 people complete the survey online, 5 attended the co-design workshop and we got to speak with over 20 people at our interactive open day in November 2019.

We received many great suggestions to improve infrastructure, added facilities, places to meet, safer connections and opportunities to increase the sense of 'place' within the neighbourhood. Overall, the community would like to see more greening within their neighbourhood through additional trees and WSUD style landscaping located within the verges and at intersections.







Precedent Board Feedback
