

## **Consultation Raw Data**

The comments below are raw data compiled from the following consultations as part of developing the Living Green: Environmental Plan 2014-2020

- Pre-consultation with 20 active members of the community, selected organisations with an impact or interest in Council operations and staff in September and October 2013.
- General community consultation through November via comments provided at events:
  - o 16 November *The Cook The Chef and the Composter* event
  - o 30 November Christmas at Our Place event
- Comments left on the Ideas Tree at Council offices between 16 November and 6
  December
- On-line consultation comments via <u>www.yoursaycharlessturt.com.au</u>
- Staff consultation from late November to early February

As many people have provided more than one comment, the total number of people involved is estimated at around 350 to 400 individuals. Approximately 650 individual comments have been considered.

Heat wave impacts on Council staff, our clubs and the general community (in the light of the information raised through the climate change adaptation program)

Undertake regional planning for climate change (under progress already) and define trigger points for actions ie. If xx event occurs or becomes apparent then yy action will need to occur - allowing budgeting and planning with uncertainty and allowing escalation of actions depending how serious the climate changes are

Investigate carbon off-set creation opportunities within urban areas jointly with other urban Councils

Protect our dunes from sea level rise

Future proof the city for climate change impacts

Amend development plans to prevent development in natural hazard zones such as flood prone and coastal areas especially in light of anticipated climate change

Develop a property acquirement plan for risk prone areas (flood and coastal zones)

investigate appropriate costing around alternative sources of water - ability to create forward financial planning on watering and future plans for alternative sources

Promote / support / develop options where flood mitigation, water quality improvements and water capture for reuse coincide

support / research / create opportunities for community scale capture as a cost effective option rather than simply forcing individual rainwater tanks - as per option at St Clair

Advocate actively for consistency across State Gov't agencies on Aquifer recharge planning

Develop methods and sites for stormwater capture at smaller sites and using mechanical solutions such as sandtraps as well as wetlands

Investigate ways to capture high flows from River Torrens and ways to clean this for recharge

May be opportunities for regional water capture which integrates with State Government directions and reticulated water systems - expanding WPW to partner closely with other Councils and State agencies

Develop partnerships with other Councils and State agencies to create opportunities for stormwater capture and use by trialling new technologies, lobbying for consistent pricing signals; lobbying for a coordinated and consistent approvals pathway for stormwater capture and aquifer recharge

Improving stormwater capture is needed in both new developments and creating options for existing houses to reduce stormwater flows &/or appropriate use of greywate and rainwater

Promote / support / develop options where flood mitigation, water quality improvements and water capture for reuse coincide

support / research / create opportunities for community scale capture as a cost effective option rather than simply forcing individual rainwater tanks - as per option at St Clair

Make median strips low to catch water and grow plants

Engineer storm water from roads onto reserves to water the river red gums especially

Recyle more water

Reduce stormwater flows and increase aquifer recharge

Review and establish targets for reducing energy use and GreenPower purchase across Council properties and energy contracts such as streetlight costs

? Worth investigating potential for Council to foster or partner- private enterprise agreements to allow ie. Small scale local transport / solar installations at Council premises or similar 'commercial' enterprises with a community outcome.

Solar panels on every roof.

Investigate appropriate locations and technologies for using windpower across the city

A park to take our pets and a bbq/picnic area

Use Kaurna names in new naming

Employ more people to garden

Ensure sustainability is incorporated into Council's procurement and contract documents replace asphalt roads with lighter coloured concrete

reduce paving including creating road swales when kerbs and gutters are due for replacement

Evaluate opportunities for biosequestration for plantings along reserves and streets

incorporate embodied energy and water considerations in purchasing policies

Already putting in LED lights. May need to consider auditing lighting stock and keeping better track of lighting infrastructure in DET / SAPN / Council control including understanding extent of electricity use

Could aim for electronic rates notices - at least for those residents who are happy to receive them . E-Rates notices via Bpay are being considered already

Reduce number of Return to Sender letters (may be as high as 20% at present) Name and address quality improvements to reduce the returned mail numbers. Australia Post barcoding (Joanne).

· Leverage the fleet and carbon offset data we have in house.

Introduce more efficient computer systems throughout Council offices - shift to virtualising the computer systems (and removing desktop systems)

Reduce staff car commute by: providing infrastructure that makes active transport easy to use; continue to look for opportunities to support public transport; consider work arrangements that reduce commute requirements

Could consider promoting / making car pool arrangements easier

Continue to reduce paper use i.e. not printing employment applications - using tablets more for writing notes / reports

Lack of consistent recycling within Council and across sections. Need to get this better and make it easy for people. Current bins don't promote 3 bin system.

Paper recycling in office is not consistent and doesn't appear to function well. Paper bins at desks don't get emptied.

Food waste bins are not used appropriately and are not cleaned so don't invite appropriate use

Opportunities to improve staff awareness on what goes into the organics bin and how its used. At moment, many staff aren't aware of ability to use kitchen caddy and what can go in the green bin

Currently, functions and events only serviced by 1 bin ie NO recycling available. This can be embarrasing for staff running the function. May be a corporate image issue rather than simply waste management

Recruitment and position descriptions don't currently have an environmental statement

Council reports 'Environmental Implications' section is possibly not well used. Could undertake training to get this used better as per OHS & Risk implications

It's about changing the way we do things rather than having just an event

Sustainability does not appear to factor into corporate processes and structures ("don't even see sustainability")

Should be included into discussions on policies

Need corporate benchmarks - recognition, footprints or other KPI / metrics for within the corporation ie. Sustainability objectives for corporation and/or KPIs prior to approvals on projects

Need to ID Council's role in environmental issues such as consistency in directions; defining the enviro / sustainability role within business units

Should define corporate position so that it can be used ie to look for funding opportunities

Need Corporate leadership in Sustainability - it has a low profile within the organisation

lack of sustainability shown by 6 cylinder vehicles

Need to be clearer on what CCS sees its role as and where it wants to be (develop Corporate directions on where to be and what is wanted in the environmental arena)

Possibilities to increase projects planning and liaison with State-Fed govts

Possibility for CCS to push improvements in Development Plan especially if corporate directions are taken to be more at forefront of sustainability issues

Opportunities for sustainability fund or thinking about how to resource projects in evnironmental area

One Planet in the Mint program is working toward a paperless business unit

Water Business Unit is active but in its infancy

Looking at paperless rates and others via eRates and eDebtors systems

Finance team is up to date on Return to Sender with addresses and has very low rates of returned mail

Team is reluctant on loans for infrastructure to community clubs/businesses as the loans are on the property rather than the proprietor

Infrastructure upgrades on community clubs is usually on a 50-50 basis but can be different depending on club. Rents charged are based on property value so some clubs are reluctant for upgrades because it will increase rents

Should shut down all computers in offices via timers or similar

Why is there cold water only in the Mint (understanding that this was energy saving decision) so why not in the rest of the building?

Better project planning scoring sheets are planned - check with Sam Higgings and Michael Lindau re Properties Matrix for upgrades to Council properties

opportunities to harness energy, passion and emotion across staff across departments to improve corporate culture

Could Timeline a proecss as per community plan

Could create corporate Think Tank options

Sustainability should become 2nd nature as per OHS and Customer Service

- o Develop/host information that can be delivered using improved technology i.e. waste management App., social media posts/events on environmental themes, car sharing booking schemes portal on website?
- o Promote the outcomes and successes of projects this can help build momentum and a sense of ownership by the community of the benefits of their rates at work in this area –ask the community how they want to learn about what Council does do the traditional forms of communication reach them?

use of apps to allow community to ID noxious weed sites or other enviro issues and let Council know of areas where problems exist? Would this work in addition to / jointly with CRMs and emails from ie BRAG

Continue 'Business Awards' to support local businesses doing good things

Develop a regular reporting process ie. State of the Environment or similar - could use TOPL development information as a basis to update data and provide information to community

Compliance needs work on internal and external awareness of regulations - who is responsible for what, what can be done, who to contact when incidents occur ie. Littering, site contamination, stormwater pollution, cigarette butts

Signage needed to be put up at Torrens Outlet after rain events to stop people swimming. Currently done by local residents. Should be easy for Council to put up signs

Better promotion of positive messages and achievements both by Council and its Community

Environmental awards are good promotion and acknowledgement of work done in community. These create a positive feel.

Need to have recognition and championing of vounteers, possibly beyond environment awards and/or tied to Living Green plan categories and/or look at Clean Streets awards or similar again; and as a way to promote action by people who may not be so active at present

Need to tell stories on neighbourhoods and sense of community; and creating forums that encourage individual discussions to occur between neighbours. These can be enviro focussed or embed enviro issues into other discussions ie waste / energy efficiency as part of migration assistance

Research & understand enviro & social impacts and needs of higher density developments

CCS will need to understand impact of increased visitors to coast ie. Beaches, service provision, waste management, landscaping etc

use of apps to allow community to ID noxious weed sites or other enviro issues and let Council know of areas where problems exist? Would this work in addition to / jointly with CRMs and emails from ie BRAG

Need to define what end points in actions are - when do we know we've accomplished what we set out to do?

Need to determine how to communicate outcomes of work and how often.

Put GPT's stats on notice board at all GPT's in tonnes/year total tonnes

I had no idea that a permit was necessary to plant my verge - perhaps that could be advertised

I'd like to see the environmental plan showing more leadership, look to other councils that are in this space. Don't just respond, pick some areas that Council can show leadership in and push for new actions.

Use a measure such as ecological footprint to measure council sustainability

Improvements in road constructions already occurring ie. Using lower CO2 emission products needing lower heat to set - highlights need to communicate activities being undertaken

Need to measure Council's Environmental performance and communicate to staff and community. Also, need to have better understanding of whether we're doing well / meeting expectations etc

Need to get better at identifying appropriate metrics, collecting them, AND communicating them to the appropriate peope.

Give information on solar panel electricity production / energy use on The Mine to all staff.

Collect and Provide environmental KPIs on rates notices etc for those who don't have access to apps.

Monitor and communicate electricity use across Council buildings esp identifying any changes in use likely associated with changes such as more efficient equipment

Develop community portals to create discussions, including providing appropriate metrics to allow local info to guide discussions

Should have corporate info on KPIs such as CO2 / waste or similar available to staff

o Council to develop an assessment criteria to determine and promote 'green' precincts within the City – encourage the community to increase patronage/support which provides incentive for business to address environmental sustainability

Council could have a role in pushing for better controls and/or supporting resident groups lobbying for better outcomes (ie. Council / Community as counter-lobby to developer lobby influence)

Council role in TOD development design / promotion

Dust control in warmer months WPTW & Cheltenham

Build all new homes at St Clair Eco Friendly and not on the park

Build more houses that are environmentally friendly

Keep our parks for all to use - no more building!

Leave the sand dunes alone and stop building so close to the beach

No high rise for St Clair Park - please keep it for our children and in memory

No more hammerhead housing in Woodville Park

No highrise / open space

Disallow fishing from Jetty and beach in summer

Disallow jet-skis

Create incentives to retain older houses on blocks ie. Via encouraging restoration or additions rather than knock-downs

Require larger private open spaces in developments & encourage planting larger species of trees in private spaces

Work on better new buildings ie greater than 6 star ratings on new developments

Better evaluation of trees at time of new developments

Mandate white rooves on new developments

Encourage Mediterranean-type development (low energy use, zero set-backs, narrow streets)

Provide guidance and encouragement for reuse of existing buildings rather than bulldozing and building new

Eliminate requirement for on-site car-parking

reduce driveway width to increase tree planting along verges

- Energy efficient public lighting (will this debate ever end...? But given the inroads made in Victoria over the past 4-5 years, we should be pushing for this harder than ever now)
- · Green buildings program making sure Council buildings are waste, water and energy efficient
- · Helping sporting and community clubs become more energy and water efficient for financial and environmental reasons
- · How reclaimed water will be used (to irrigate public reserves etc.)

Investigate options for community scale clean energy development ie renting roofspace; creating larger systems which community members can buy into (talk to Campbelltown Council about whether / how this is progressing)

Continue to support the Water Business Unit for creation of a feasible water solution for Council and local business use

Provide focussed and practical advise on reducing stormwater flows and improving energy and water efficiency for residents - could do different levels ie easy for 'curious' but not committed or for renters; and high level focussed for 'committed' and 'interested' house owners

Develop community outreach programs on water efficiency - information / workshops and communication on water use to create understanding of what is low / med/ high use and how to change use patterns

Continue to improve energy and water efficiency of Council premises and become more active at engaging with residents and businesses

Could also help people ID and implement water efficiency and irrigation projects as well as continuing to support community gardens

investigate appropriate costing around alternative sources of water - ability to create forward financial planning on watering and future plans for alternative sources

More incentives for water-wise gardens. Eg dripper systems, rainwater tanks

Allow rainwater for drinking

Every house should be provided FREE solar panels and rainwater tanks

Establish urban forests, with aim to allow access without seeing or hearing the urban environment

avoid lighting in areas where nocturnal species can exist

establish dog and cat-free zones along corridors such as RTLP

opportunities to improve weed control around Council area - investigate use of steam rather than glyphosate; weeding via hand rather than truck driving around with generic spray

Develop better planting lists for Council's own work - focussing on natives including in formal plantings

Need to create internal knowledge and skills to manage biodiversity and wetlands. Can not rely on volunteers solely as is a specialised profession, though can work with volunteers if able to give appropriate support and trainign

Review weed control by Council to become best practice - using non-chemical means; and communication with community about when, what, why is occurring in relation to weed control

Expand Council use of local provenance plants - ie set local provenance as first option rather than opting for similar looking but foreign plants (eg a local plant looks and acts similar to an english box plant for borders; a local provenance pig-face rather than one from East coast)

Need policies on using local provenance plants or sterile hybrids to avoid cross-hybridisation

Develop policies on use of infill soil to reduce weed contamination especially in biodiversity areas such as Coast Park.

Training and policies on appropriate weed control in biodiversity areas such as how to use glyphosate and/or mowing appropriately

Commit to onground staff for biodiversity management ie. Both field staff who undertake appropriate weed management as well as people able to support community volunteer groups with info / admin / resources when needed

Council needs policies on using local provenance in new constructions, especially along coastal areas (ex Point Malcolm reserve re-work initially planted non-local plants which needed to be ripped out and replaced)

ID opportunities to promote bees in appropriate parts of the city ie. Via CBD Bees http://www.cbdbees.com/#!about/c21r

Poisonous sprays should not be sold, old fashioned measures used instead

Don't spray chemicals on verges or on windy days

Local council to provide a piece of land for The Bee Society to encourage bees back to the suburbs. Will be looked after by The Bee Society

Councils stop chemical spraying on verges

Find some information/history about our old trees before they are all gone/to add value to build appreciation

Stop pesticide use

Make residents liable for street trees / create disincentives for killing street trees

Develop streetscape plans, consider green infrastructure as important as drains and powerlines.

Review street tree planting, pruning and care practices

Review Council practices on redevelopment especially relating to retaining trees (eg Jubilee reserve near Hawkesbury way)

Encourage appropriate housing orientation and open space for large tree planting in private land

Develop and expand street tree and verge planting lists using native and local provenance species

Allow / promote community verge development

Could integrate street plantings with biodiversity - ie. Using local plants in roundabouts and verges; showcasing native plants in formal garden settings (showing they aren't 'scraggly bush plants'); or creating butterfly gardens

Old tyres on top of each other to grow eg strawberries in

Freeing up space in public roundabouts/verges that are now generally weeds/neglected

We need to grow more plants

Councils should reward ratepayers for looking after the council verge - encourage more planting

Empower local councils so that local people can have a greater say in how their environment is treated

Lobby for public nudity [or acceptance of more appropriate clothing for climate] to reduce need to dress based on European standards

Work with industry & TAFE to encourage preservation of buildings including reuse of industrial buildings and/or garages for living space

lobby to rescind regulations under the Waterworks Act and the Sewerage Act which limit street tree species

Encourage alternative press/news via advertising within it and providing more direct advise

Foster and promote collaborative consumption / collaborative purchasing programs ie Share and Save program; Tool Libraries

Develop (or work with private agencies to develop) sharing or trading programs for high-value / low use equipment ie. Similar to airbnb or ebay where users are 'scored' allowing wider scale collaborative consumption

Create clear policies on how Council can support community activity ie. How to create changes at local reserves; what types of events can be supported and how

Council has role as facilitator of community action ie with schools, interest groups. It could communicate information and outcomes of community based programs

Council needs to be flexible and listen to local group needs rather than directing groups (support rather than create). In Val's words "don't treat us like staff"

People can grow plants on their walls & rooves, in the gutters - 7yr old

Encouraging neighbours to swap fruit & get to know each other

Ask your neighbours, family and friends if they want a native tree in their yard

Food swaps

I would love to see the council giving local backyard gardeners the opportunity to be part of a 'produce swap' type co-op to minimise waste and shave? what we have

Give household food scraps to your chooks. Eat & share the eggs, put chook poo into the garden along with crushed egg shells

Support for community environmental groups

Help our community foodies continue our work!!!

Encourage people to join local dune care groups including the one at the Marine Discovery Centre

Work with local groups (ie Hindmarsh Greening and others) to green suburbs including providing trees / equipment etc

- o 'speed-date' an architect specialising in energy and water efficiency in the home (City of Marion example Council facilitates these types of opportunities),
- o host 'thinker in residence' type events on various environmental issues to raise awareness and increase community conversation in this space,
- o use art to convey environmental issues
- o tailor Council strategies/information for various demographics i.e. youth-targeted programs, seniors, MUDs the messages and call to action could be different for each group, and perhaps tailoring our programs might see more success rather than one-size fits all?

Can Council promote native plants in private gardens - also as a means to have rare local provenance plants as a seed source for future propagation (particularly working with very active / interested locals)?

Investigate working with Conservation Council on Green Home or similar community outreach / education program

More info / education on what goes down the drain, types of household chemicals and appropriate disposal (plus consequences of poor disposal); weeds and nuisance plants' grass clippings; appropriate car washing etc

Provide information on why environmental nuisance fines are given and why actions are detrimental to educate people

Use of existing community programs such as Marine Discovery Centre as a means for fostering environmental responsibility across community and reaching schools

Need to work with / create community enthusiasm and involvement for creating and maintaining biodiversity areas and habitats (? Volunteering programs; partnering with TAFE / VET programs?)

Continue recycling week / World Environment Day events

Encourage stewardship across the community. Council can encourage local action on looking after the local environment, which could include education on unsuitable plants in landscaping. Should consider a person dedicated to supporting local action

CCS could have a role in helping residents design storwater harvesting and /or water sensitive households, and helping people see how environmental issues apply to them. Perhaps re-start the Energy Smart program?

Identify and train volunteers to work as "recycling ambassadors" to work at Council events in helping stallholders, clients and patrons to use source items such as biodegradable cutlery, crockery and cups and to use the bin stations appropriately. Encourage or insist that stallholders use paper bags or no bags for their products – some bad examples at Christmas at Our Place.

As done in 2013, use other council events such as Christmas at our Place to get the green word out.

Run a pilot project where a resident is identified for a street, a block or a small suburb and becomes that area's "green ambassador". The Council keeps that person in the loop about achievements, events, changes to processes and that person passes on that information and reinforces the Council's message. ie initiatives such as the kitchen caddy/worm farm/compost offer, changes to the use of the Green Bins, plant offers, sustainable events, relevant infrastructure projects can be passed on more personally. Information about how to use the 3 bins, what to put in them , how to compost and other small but important information can be dissemated in an informal way, also encouraging neighbourhood and community building.

start a "green" emailing list whereby it notifies people who have signed up to it, perhaps via a regular e-newsletter, about achievements, events, changes to processes.

Related to above - use SmartMeter & RFID info to provide hhold level info to them, as well as info on average / efficient use as means to create education opportunities and target education activities

Look for opportunities to leverage our mapping capabilities here in IS, perhaps partnering with DEWNR/NRM for base datasets and in Identifying the types of mapping information available which may be mutually useful ie. Extent of green cover; extent / location of LED streetlights; number of maintenance calls / faults and different types of lights; location / health of verges adopted by community

Look to collect Infra-red mapping imagery to assist with weed mapping and general plant use and health across the City; extent of watering and developing mowing schedules. Need non-IS expert to interpret data and to communicate to Council and community
