1 Key Issue – Loading Zone. Military Road behind Baju / H2O. Bus Zone + 2 car park entrances – Redesign & monitor compliance:

- 1. Military Road between Main Street & York Street
 - Unsafe buses, cars, deliveries (trucks in loading bay)
 - Trucks hang out over footpath
 - Wait in bus zone
 - Wait across road
 - Too tall for loading dock required to reverse back onto Military Road
 - Buses restrict sight distance south along Military Road
 - Compliance drivers parking over cross-overs when loading zone is closed hence over footpath.

- Alternate storage location / layover of trucks waiting to access loading zone
- Scheduling of delivery trucks / size of delivery trucks
- Consider bus layover location preference for trucks to be "fixed" / shifted rather than cars.
- Left only in and out to car park (ban right turns into driveway access points)
- Pedestrian safety crossing is an important consideration.

2 Key Issue – Baju / H2O car park is NOT as per original approved plans:

- Cost per 1st hour increased 40%
- Hours of operation are reduced by 40% / 20hrs per week
- Workers do not use the car park and park in surrounding streets (was free parking for workers in original application)
- 1. Pavillion car park
 - Opening hours not being adhered to
 - Parking fees increased from proposal
 - Staff not using it / aware it should be available to them
 - 150 car parks. 110 available / empty at any given time
- 2.
- Developer to comply with requirement
- Utilise car park to its capacity
- Awareness that this is available to public
- Get cars off street
- 4. Possible resistance from developer likely
- 5. Pros: potentially 150 off streets
- 6. Council to enforce / negotiate development requirements subsidy for extending the free hours (cheaper for Council than building a new car park)

3 Key Issue – (Carrot) Dedicated family drop-off points near beach coupled with free carparking @ vacant land (stick) metered parking near beach:

- Extreme seasonal parking

 - Improve amenity & Safety for residents
 - Facilitate people access to businesses for beach

 - Seasonally there are more cars than parks close to beach
 - Traffic congestion; safety, traffic speed & movement
- 4.
- Visitors want easy car parks near beach
- Businesses want customers
- Residents managed visitation

4 Key Issue – Install Safe pedestrian crossing places over Seaview & Military Road:

New Key Issue – Pedestrian Crossing on Grange Road, near Military Road. E.g. Pedestrian Island (near kindy, school, bus stop, doctor, shops & café)

- 2. Safe locations for pedestrians to cross (shown on map next page), safe location to cross on Grange Road (two points)
- 3. Pedestrian refuse too close to roundabout, dangerous, people find it hard to cross.
 - HBR tired looking / amenity
 - Roundabout unattractive
 - Speed high adjacent to reserve
 - 15% not taken into account in traffic speeds
- 5. Multiple stakeholders e.g. DPTI / Council

Key Issue – Investigate a 40kmh speed limit throughout the wider Henley Beach Study Area:

Key Issue - Investigate a 40kmh or 25kmh speed limit on Seaview Road in the Henley Square Precinct

- About safety (cars, cyclists & pedestrians) and amenity (noise, calmness)
- 40kmh in Henley Precinct
- Ideally 25kmh on Seaview Road (north to south). ?? concerns with pushing traffic to other streets
- Situation Now

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- 3 crossings which create dangerous environment
- Speeding vehicles
- Congestion in traffic (particularly Military)
 - Due to new car park
 - Foodland Supermarket
 - Businesses
 - More people entering area
- Hoon driving
- Used as a throughfare from adjoining suburbs
- Different Views
- DPTI may not support 40kmh
- Concern by residents on streets within Henley Square (precinct) would push traffic to other streets
- Increased travel time for people outside area
- Goal
- Make Henley Beach a pleasant & Safe destination not a thoroughfare ©
- Encourage through traffic to Tapleys Hill Road
- Henley Precinct (Square) shared zone.
